- Collects and holds materials and information related to the history of Maui
- Works for the preservation of Maui's History
- Conducts outreach to the children of Maui through special school programs
- Conducts continuing lectures and tours to promote an appreciation of Maui

THE MAUI HISTORICAL SOCIETY OWNS AND OPERATES THE BAILEY HOUSE MUSEUM

- A mission home built in 1833 on the royal compound of Kehekili, last chief of Maui, at the mouth of Iao Valley
- Displays and archives:
 - Hawaiian Artifacts
 - Missionary Era Artifacts
 - 19th Century Paintings of Maui by Edward Bailey
 - Archeological and Natural History Materials

THE MAUI HISTORICAL SOCIETY OPERATES

- Archival Resource Center which preserves and makes available for research:
 - Archives includes maps, manuscripts and documents of various organizations
 - Photo Collection of over 8,000 photographs
 - A Library of books dating back to 1870
 - Curatorial and Archival Contract with the Kaho`olawe Island Reserve Commission to preserve, store, and display the Kaho`olawe Collection of records, documents and artifacts
- Historic gardens which feature plants typical of the missionary era as well as native Hawaiian plants typical of ancient Hawai'i
- Museum Gift Shop of outstanding quality, selling Hawaiian crafts and books
